## ROY D. MERRITT FOR U. S. PRESIDENT CAMPAIGN SPEECH # 47

- Hello, I'm Roy Merritt and I am running as a candidate for the presidency of the U. S. A. in 2024
- I want to remind all Americans again today that my speech forms part of my political platform, which is established by all of my prior speeches and political publications. My platform will endure whether I am ever elected president of the U. S. A. or not, and it will also remain part of my legacy after my death
- My speech today, Campaign Speech #47, centers on my views concerning NMSU here in Las Cruces, New Mexico, where I received my doctorate from in 1994
- Although it was difficult, I kept silent about the university for the first year or so after I had retired back here to Las Cruces in 2020. I was informed early on by someone that the university didn't even know that I existed
- Although I was somewhat embarrassed by that, it certainly fit the mold of what I might have expected from the university. Even when I was here, it was clear that the university was giving priority to Hispanic students, whom I believe it considered as its primary mission
- After my return to the area, I wanted to determine if the University was the same as it appeared to me some 30 years ago or more when I was here as a student from 1990-94
- Did it appear that they were on a mission in general to inculcate their students with the same dissident, revolutionary, anti-American, treasonous and *coup d' étatist* philosophies?

- After that first year, when all the vandalism, crimes, terrorism and evil began, somewhat seemingly coincident with the end of the COVID "lockdown," I came to the conclusion that "Yes, it is the same place"
- The university had, and presumably still has its proverbial "head and feet" planted firmly in Mexico and showed no inclination to advise students that they were living in the U. S. A., and therefore should adapt themselves to living In America: learn and use the English language, integrate themselves intimately in American society, emulate the ways that Americans lived—that is, in a free but disciplined and peaceful manner—follow the American creed, American laws, the U. S. Constitution, and the ideals and principles of the Declaration of Independence
- And, following up on that, if they did not want to live in America, the way it was and is, then they should leave. Americans have no obligation whatsoever to live like recent Hispanic, Spanish-speaking immigrants
- Unfortunately, that did not happen. And I must tell the American nation that the State of New Mexico is much more like Mexico and Spain than it is the U. S. A. I feel like I have absolutely nothing in common with most of the people of southern New Mexico
- Therefore, again, New Mexico, as it exists now is "gone"—"lost" as a State of the American Union. A silent coup d' é tat has taken place gradually over the last 30 or more so years. As this is a fait accompli, then I believe that the U. S. A. should make it official. Kick the State out of the Union of American States until it can get itself "fixed," if possible. "Fixing," in my view may necessarily involve the expatriation of large numbers of current "citizens" and residents of the State
- In the meantime, no other Americans should think of retiring to the State of New Mexico. It has been a complete disaster and fiasco for my spouse

and myself. Also, I recommend that if students nationwide want to attend an American university, then they should not consider attending either of the two major universities in the State of New Mexico


- However, based on my doctoral dissertation completed at the university in 1994, I believe that you can have a globalist, planetary philosophy and perspective without leaving the U. S. A. After all, I do not think the people of *MEXICO* have a globalist, planetary perspective. Instead, they live in a very ego-centrist Mexican and Hispanic, self-consuming way. They are concerned with day-to-day living and have little time or patience for a globalist philosophy and Planet Earth mentality
- And, as for as NMSU is concerned though, it needs to find a way, if it continues to exist, NOT to train and educate dissidents, rebels, revolutionaries terrorists, traitors, criminals, vandals, and people in general who are bent on the destruct5ion of the U. S. A.
- The U. S. A. is not ultimately going to change to "fit" you. You have to adapt to the U. S. A.
- Citizens, like me, should not have to fight a "war" of attrition with people like you in our retirements and in the latter years of our lives. You do not have the right to destroy our peaceful lives, happiness and contentment, or take away our guaranteed Constitutional rights, freedoms and protections. You have to discipline and constrain yourselves to live under the laws and the Constitution of the U. S. A.
- I noted also after returning here in 2020 that two of the university's mottoes were displayed prominently up and down the main drag of campus—that is, University Avenue

- The signs urged returning, new and future students to be "bold" and "creative"
- In most locales in the U. S. A., these advisements would be sane and reasonable to students. However, the more that I have thought about it, I do not believe that this advice should be given to Hispanic students here in New Mexico
- As it is, a lot of other people are encouraged to be "bold" and "creative," including burglars, bank robbers, vandals and criminals of all types, et cetera
- Students should not be trained and educated to be "bold" and "creative" if it means becoming traitors and terrorists to the U. S. A. They should also NOT be "bold" and "creative":
  - (1) ... if it means being a revolutionary or counter-revolutionary
  - (2) ...if it means NOT learning, speaking, and using daily the official language of the U. S. A., that is, English
  - (3) ...if it means having as many children as you want at the expense of and burden to American society
  - (4) <u>...if it means</u> invading another country, another individual's property, or trespassing
  - (5) ...if it means NOT loving your country and its pre-existing citizens
  - (6) ...if it means NOT supporting your country's Constitution
  - (7) ...if it means NOT obeying your country's laws
  - (8) ...if it means NOT respecting your country's flag
  - (9) ...if it means NOT defending your country against all enemies
  - (10) ...if it means conspiring to overthrow the legitimate government of your country
  - (11) ...if it means NOT being a loyal and faithful citizen of your country
  - (12) ...if it means being selfish and concerned only about yourself
  - (13) ...if it means NOT respecting your elders, including your own parents

- (14) ...if it means NOT following your chosen faith and religion
- (15) ...if it means living an amoral, unethical and valueless life
- (16) ...if it means becoming a criminal and vandal
- (17) ...if it means criminally rearing your children
- (18) ...if it means being un-civic, uncivil and uncivilized
- (19) ...if it means living, and desiring to live, in a lawless, chaotic and anarchic manner in society
- (20) <u>...if it means</u> disturbing or destroying the peace, contentment and happiness of another person, especially deliberately
- Again, continuing on with this train of thought, students at NMSU, or any other university in the U. S. A. for that matter, should NOT be trained and educated to be "bold" and "creative":
  - (21) ...if it means NOT implementing law and order
  - (22) ...if it means NOT protecting people and property by law enforcement
  - (23) <u>...if it means</u> NOT generally respecting the property of others, no matter who they are
  - (24) ...if it means NOT being a good citizen, or being a lazy and unproductive citizen
  - (25) ...if it means NOT having a land ethic and protecting the environment you live in
  - (26) <u>...if it means</u> committing environmental terrorism day and night as a way of life and living
  - (27) ...if it means being an "evil doer," as former president Republican George H. W. Bush used to say
  - (28) ...if it means NOT giving back to those who have given so much to you
  - (29) ...if it means NOT living for someone or something greater than yourself, as former presidential candidate, Republican Senator John McCain used to advise
  - (30) ...if it means vandalizing and destroying anything on another

person's property

- (31) ...if it means attempting to enforce laws, regulations and ordinances that are NOT consonant with the U. S. Constitution
- (32 <u>...if it means</u> that police and law enforcement are NOT doing their jobs, NOT protecting and defending citizens and property, and NOT enforcing the laws of the U. S. A.
- (33) ...if it means scamming, extorting, or swindling from fellow citizens
- (34) ...if it means having local, County, State and federal government officials committing treasonous and tyrannous acts
- (35) ...if it means perpetrating hate crimes
- (36) ...if it means discriminating against others in any way, or refusing to serve others of another ethnic group
- (37) ...if it means committing acts of reprisal and retribution against other citizens
- (38) ...if it means doing contractual work of a lesser quality for one ethnic group than another
- (39) ...if it means refusing to do appropriate and necessary services and perform needed repairs based on ethnic differences
- (40) ...if it means committing repetitive, willful, purposeful, malicious, terroristic acts against other citizens
- Students and ordinary citizens should not be "bold" and "creative" if it means:
  - (41) ...if it means believing that another country owes you and your family a better life
  - (42) ...if it means NOT having good intentions when you become a citizen of another country, or if it means obtaining your citizenship under false pretenses
  - (43) ...if it means NOT owing your primary allegiance to the U. S. A. as your new adopted country
  - (44) ...if it means having sentiments of strong and over-riding



and committing criminal acts

- (60) ...if it means having an active, unlawful, unionized group of criminal workers
- (61) ...if it means cheating and cutting corners in order to get ahead
- (62) ...if it means turning to crime and terrorism to get what you want out of life
- (62) <u>...and, in my view, if it means</u> NOT using and applying the Biblical Ten Commandments in everyday life and living
- Of course, after living here in New Mexico over the past three years or so, I could go on and on about why university students, citizens and people in general should NOT be "bold" and "creative" if it means having to accommodate all the downsides and negatives of living here. My spouse and I have experienced all of these with the three-plus years of terroristic and treasonous attacks of Democratic-Hispanic operatives here at our retirement home and property in Las Cruces, New Mexico. These extended downward from governments and leaders at all levels in our nation, from Traitor Joe Biden and his Vice President at the federal level, to the Governor of New Mexico and other State leaders, to Doña Ana County officials and workers, to the city of Las Cruces and its law enforcers, to the leaders of New Mexico State Terrorist University, and to Terror Valley, New Mexico
- All of the people who inflicted the last three-plus years of terrorism on my wife and myself were extremely "bold" and extremely "creative." I have previously already said that these individuals were very sophisticated in their operation of terrorism and infliction of terroristic attacks. They were "bold" and "creative" in being very free in their behavior and manner, and in carrying out their never ceasing, nefarious criminal and vandalistic ambushes requiring courage in execution

• These terrorists and traitors to my spouse and myself, and to the United States of America, were "bold bad men" (Edmund Spenser, The Faerie Queene, 1590 and William Shakespeare, King Henry the Eighth, 1613).

Although many writers have encouraged such men NOT to be "too bad" and "too bold," these aforementioned individuals clearly were. And just what makes men so? Shakespeare said in *King Henry the Eighth* that what makes robbers bold was too much *lenity* (or leniency)

- Publius Vergilis Maro, a.k.a. Virgil (70-19 B. C.), in his *Eclogues*, advised: "Yield not to evils, but attack all the more boldly."
- Another adage or maxim admonishes, "Be bold in what you stand for, but careful in what you fall for."
- In my campaign, I have tried to follow the advice of the Swiss poet and mystic, Johann Kaspar Lavater (1741-1801):

"...when called upon to speak a disagreeable truth, [tell] it boldly..." [Aphorisms on Man, c. 1788, no. 302]

• As a person, but perhaps not as a politician, I am likely closest to Teddy Roosevelt. In his book *The Strenuous Life* (1900), he wrote:

"If we seek merely swollen, slothful ease and ignoble peace, if we shrink from the hard contests where men must win at the hazard of their lives and at the risk of all they hold dear, then bolder and stronger people will pass us by, and will win for themselves the domination of the world."
