ROY D. MERRITT FOR U. S. PRESIDENT CAMPAIGN SPEECH # 27

- I'm Roy Merritt and I'm a candidate for the President of the U. S. A. in 2024
- The Democratic Party Hispanic terrorists of New Mexico long ago lost all perspective in their extreme hate for America and for my wife and I as representations of our country
- My wife and I as citizens of the U. S. A. are seen by these Hispanic terrorists of the Democratic Party as an integral part of America, and they hate everything about America and what it stands for
- ullet That is why long ago, they turned into revolutionaries, traitors, terrorists and *coup* d' \acute{e} *tatists* against their own country—the nation and people who took them in when no one else would
- The ingrained evil of these terrorists extends beyond all bounds, and they long past lost all sense of reason and proportion in their hate
- Because of this hate for the American people and our way of life in the U. S. A., they turned to terrorism as a way to coerce, extort and over time extract out of our nation what they desire
- These Hispanic terrorists of the Democratic Party are the most selfish people in the world
- They want to continue to live as they did in their old countries—in an undisciplined, chaotic, anarchic and lawless society
- They want to live in a multilingual country that permits them to force the Spanish language down the throats of the American people
- They want all the "freebies" our country can provide
- They want to have as many children as they can thrust onto American society
- The economic demands of such large numbers of dependents will eventually turn the U. S. A. into Mexico, India, or some other very similar 3rd-world country
- America is already on a downward spiral and trajectory and has been since at least the turn of the 21st century

- Civilization on Planet Earth has stalled and reversed its course since that time
- We, as a nation, are much more uncivilized than we were in the year 2000
- It will take major new initiatives in leadership to reverse this downward spiral of civilization in the U. S. A. and on Planet Earth as a whole
- One of these initiatives is and must be the compelled integration of Hispanics into American society if they are to remain in the country
- They cannot and must not continue to remain isolated and apart from the rest of American society
- The most dominant thrust of this demanded integration will be the push to toss multiculturalism into the ash bins of history
- There is nothing to be gained, and everything to be lost, should we as a nation continue on the course of two separate and unequal societies of Spanish-speaking Hispanics and English-speaking Anglos
- Of course, historically America is a Eurocentric country, and in my view, must always be so if we are to progress and move forward to a more civilized and less barbarous world
- Historically speaking, there is nothing positive that can come from trying to force America to become more like Mexico and Spain
- This path will only lead to Civil War, and war is only naturally taken on as a last resort in order to reset the course of history
- Currently, the State of New Mexico is a very divided, chaotic, anarchic and lawless society
- There are extremely strong resentments and hate on both sides
- However, as partially invited guests and partial unwanted invaders into the U. S.
 A., Hispanics cannot continue on the course and path that they are on now
- •Resetting this course will take unprecedented efforts and demands of leadership in government at all levels
- I personally believe that it will require new-age leadership rather than the stale, old-age leadership of the past era

- The two current party leaders—Democratic and Republican— are representatives of the past era of leadership and will not be able to put America on a course that will alter the downward spiral and trajectory of our nation
- I do not believe that what has happened to my wife and myself over the past several years since our return to New Mexico in 2020 has been accidental. It may very well have been pre-ordained by God
- The level of rancor and strife, division, chaos and dissidence may have been required in order to force a renewed focus on the issues now tearing our nation apart
- One of the major causes of the current state of affairs in our nation has been the ultra-liberal thrust of academic institutions in the U. S. A. since at least the 1960s
- The inevitable course of this ultra-liberality has now led to revolutionary sentiment, non-democratic principles, governmental actions and programs, terrorism and anarchy
- As you know, I have focused perhaps too strongly on the one institution closest to me—NMSU— in my own grasp of understandings related to the ultra-liberal pathway of American academia
- Perhaps 30-40 years ago, many people pointed out that the vast majority of professors in academia were liberals of the Democratic Party
- Conservatives were shunned and cast aside as unworthy to be a part of higher-level educational philosophy and academic leadership
- When I was beginning my tenure at NMSU in 1990, many of us graduate students were warned that obtaining our doctorates could very well be strong negatives to our career paths forward, especially for white-men academics
- It was pointed out that over 70 percent of the professors in academia at that time were while males
- That was perceived then as a major problem and was in some ways
- However, the steps taken to try to correct these inequities were in hindsight not the most effective
- For example, institutions like NMSU, felt that it was a part of their mission as a State university in the U. S. A. to give priority to hiring Spanish-speaking Hispanic professors from Mexico and the southern Americas to correct for these inequities

- This resulted in further pushing aside of Conservatives in academia, and many of us were branded and targeted, became further alienated, and were discriminated against in our own country in the worst ways possible
- In 1994, after receiving my doctorate at NMSU, I would say that I was likely at the apex of my professional career and should have been highly sought after for positions in academia in America
- As you may already know from my prior speeches, I grew up the poorest of the poor in the poverty-stricken state of West Virginia in the 1950s and 1960s
- While a child, I had polio, but this only seemed in my case particularly to cause me to push that much harder to achieve success
- It was a struggle for me of unprecedented proportions, but I was able to go on to garner dual higher-education degrees in science and education at all three levels—baccalaureate, Master's and doctoral
- I developed what I would call a strong résumé of credentials and qualifications, but I always felt that I was the subject of strong reversed discrimination all through my latter career
- In fact, I was never able to have an academic career after I left NMSU in 1994
- After my graduation, and despite my intense desire and interest in continuing to teach, do research, write and publish in academia, I was never able to obtain a position in the U. S. A. where I could do so
- I naturally developed strong resentments because of this. What specifically made others more deserving of an academic career than me?
- •In 1994, after my graduation and obtaining my doctoral degree from NMSU, I was told to "go away"
- The university felt that it was their mission to bring in unseasoned younger bilingual Hispanic instructors from Mexico to fill open positions
- I don't know if they ever weighed in the fact that this could very well be discriminating against more deserving American citizens of higher professional credentials and qualifications in their own country
- This push by higher-education institutions here in New Mexico and across our country has led to the current state of affairs that we have in our nation

- We have a very divided country and society
- We now have a large sub-population of Spanish-speaking Hispanic immigrants who see themselves as "special" and above the rest of American society
- This is when there is absolutely nothing at all "special" about them other than from a negative standpoint based on their economic, social and other related effects on American society
- As a matter of fact, American society and civilization have deteriorated disproportionately as the numbers of Hispanic citizens in the U. S. A. has increased dramatically since 1990
- This state of affairs has progressed until today where we find ourselves as a divided nation on the precipice of a second civil war
- In fact, this war has already commenced here in New Mexico, and is evidenced by the revolutionary sentiments, rebellion, lawlessness, chaos, anarchy and state of terrorism our nation finds itself in today
- The situation here in New Mexico is proof positive that the first battles in this war have already begun, and it will take incredibly decisive new-age leadership in order to bring this war to a peaceful resolution
- I believe that some very difficult steps and actions must be taken to avoid a full-fledged second Civil War in America
- Hispanic terrorists of the Democratic Party are now heavily perceived by most Americans as blood-sucking parasites and pariahs, and a malignant cancer growing on American society that must be excised if we are to move forward as one nation under God
- The current leadership of the Democratic Party nationwide will be unable to thwart this second civil conflagration
- The nation as a whole must begin to move forward to implement more Conservative and conserving solutions if we are to survive and prosper as a democracy and republic in the U. S. A., and as well on Planet Earth as a whole
- This is a mission in which we cannot fail if we are to subsist and endure as a human species on Planet Earth—"the little blue marble"
